### Alondra Park Tax Strike Continues, Secretary Says

Alondra Park taxpayers were urged this week by Pat MacDonnell, secretary of the Alondra Park Property Owners' Committee, to follow the policy adopted last year and refuse to pay special assessments.

The action last year, a virtual tax strike as far as the Alondra Park district was concerned, expedited start of refunding proceedings for the area.

With \$618,000 in Mattoon acquisition and improvement bonds against the district, the board of supervisors took action to help taxpayers by appropriating approximately half the amount. Refunding proceedings now under way are expected to be completed by next spring so that a housing program can be launched in the district.

**Request Separate Bill**  
When tax bills are received property owners should return them to the county tax collector's office with the request that they be amended and a separate bill be issued for the park district taxes, MacDonnell advised.

Tax bills may be brought to the office of Gardena Valley Chamber of Commerce, 16420 South Vermont avenue, and the office will take care of sending them in with the request for a separate bill, MacDonnell announced.

"Refunding proceedings are progressing as rapidly as possible and any change in the program, such as paying park taxes along with other tax bills, would retard rather than assist the program," MacDonnell said.

### Change In Accounting for City Departments Approved by Council

Logan R. Cotton, city auditor, suggested several changes in city bookkeeping methods "for more efficient accounting" in a letter to the city council Tuesday night. He requested permission to make the changes that are "agreeable to the various department heads." This permission was granted. Auditor Cotton did not mention any details of the proposed improved accounting methods or state where they would be instituted.

### County Gives Property Back to Torrance

City Clerk A. H. Bartlett announced receipt of the deed to the triangular property at the intersection of Carson street and Plaza del Amo (next to the County Health Center) from the board of supervisors yesterday. The property thus reverts back to city ownership. It was deeded to the county several years ago when the Health Center was being planned but was never used. The Torrance Coordinating Council has suggested that the site be used for the proposed Boys' Club building which is now under study by the city council.

Four persons were slightly injured as result of an automobile collision at the four-way boulevard-stopped intersection of Figueroa avenue and Carson street Tuesday night. According to deputy sheriffs who investigated, Charles Hamer, 37, San Pedro, skidded thru the intersection while driving on Carson by Margaret street, Torrance.
