



**Cross-Country Running Revived at
Torrance High School Field Today**

Revival of cross-country running at Torrance high school after nearly five years inactivity in that sport was due this afternoon when seven lopers were scheduled to enter the first annual handicap race arranged by Pete Zamperini, track coach. They will be striving for the honor of having their names engraved on the large silver trophy which was put up by the Torrance Kiwanis club in 1934 and won twice by Louis Zamperini. The mile and one-half race was scheduled to start on the high school track at 3 o'clock. The entries and their handicap advantages, worked out by Coach Zamperini after careful analysis of each one's ability, are:

Gerald McDonald, who holds the course record of 7m. 52s, will start from scratch; Keith Nash gets a 15-second lead, Harry Hiller, 32 seconds; Everett Leathman, 47 seconds; Charles Rippey, 53 seconds; George Smith and Warren Edwards get a 60-second lead over McDonald. Two of the Tartars' cross-country gallopers, Frank Whiting and Richard Pearson, will not compete, each having only recently recovered from the flu. Whiting is considered one of the best cross-country lopers in the Los Angeles city school district.

Owners of the establishments are directed to appear before Superior Judge Emmet H. Wilson on that date and show cause why they should not be permanently restrained from operating.

Previous to this action, card rooms in Ocean Park, Gardena, Hawthorne and Los Angeles have been closed by the district attorney's office. Basis of the complaint is that the form of gambling is a nuisance and harmful to the residents of the communities and to the established business enterprises there.
