**Pork Chops with Mushroom Gravy**  
Breakfast by Mary Lee Taylor January 9, 1941

1/4 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon pepper  
6 pork chops, which weigh (1 1/2 lbs.)  
1 tablespoon hot shortening  
1/2 cup water

3 tablespoons finely cut onion  
10 1/2-oz. can condensed cream of mushroom soup\*  
1/2 cup Pea Milk

Mix salt with pepper. Sprinkle on both sides of pork chops. Brown pork chops slowly on both sides in skillet in hot shortening. Add onion and continue cooking for 5 minutes longer. Drain off fat. Pour over pork chops a mixture of mushroom soup, milk and water. Cover and simmer for 30 minutes, or until chops are tender. Turn occasionally while cooking. Serves 6.  
\*Condensed celery soup may be substituted for the mushroom soup.



## Flying Cadets Study a 'Bottleneck' in Defense

### Final Action On Grand Jury List Due Next Week

Final action is to be taken on the list of names for possible service on the 1941 county grand jury at a meeting of the superior court judges set for Wednesday, Jan. 15, it is announced by Superior Judge B. Rey Schauer, presiding judge.

Approximately 125 names were submitted by 50-odd judges last month, and some of these may be eliminated, if any of the judges know of valid reasons why any of the nominees are not qualified for the county inquisitorial body. Judge Schauer asked his colleagues on the bench to file their objections with him by today.

Also to be decided at the Jan. 15 meeting is the matter of electing a judge to the Children's Conciliation Court, the naming of a juvenile court judge, and the report of Judge Ben B. Lindsey which asks elimination of the office of director of conciliation, now held by Rosalind Bates.
