Redondo Plunge Changes Hours In Swim Schedule During the balance of the winter and spring months certain changes will be effective in the daily schedule of open hours for the Redondo Beach Plunge, according to Roy McClelland, manager of the world-famous warm salt water swimming establishment.

The new schedule provides all plunge and bathhouse facilities available on week days from 2 until 10 p. m. (except on Wednesdays when the plunge will be closed all day) and on Saturdays from 9 a. m. until 10 p. m. Sunday hours will be from 9:30 a. m. until 6 p. m.

Deadline Nears For Auto Plates Without Penalty

Last chance to avoid the rush for license plates!

Such was the warning issued today by the Department of Motor Vehicles to all motor owners who have not yet applied for their 1941 license plates.

Inasmuch as penalties will be due on all registration and license fees unpaid after Feb. 4, Director James M. Carter predicted record breaking crowds at most of the department's 75 branch and sub-branch offices throughout the state all of next week and until the renewal period closes.

Hundreds of thousands of motorists have not yet applied for their plates, the Department announced. Unless they do so before midnight of Feb. 4 (and that's just 10 days off!) they must pay a penalty equal to 100 percent of the registration fee and 50 percent of the motor vehicle license fee (in lieu tax).

Director Carter reiterated oft repeated instructions to look for the total amount of the fee due on the lower left hand corner of the 1941 registration card. Post card notices are not being mailed out to the motorists this year.

To secure new plates the applicant is required to present only his 1940 registration card and the amount of the fee in cash, bank draft, certified check or bank or postal money order at any branch office. If it is inconvenient to make such a trip the card and fee may be mailed to Sacramento. Do not, the Department advises, send currency through the mails.

And hurry if you want to avoid paying double.
