**Pancakes**

Woodstock Mary Lee Taylor  
Woodstock, Pa. 20, 1941  
MKX 10:45 A.M. THURSDAY  
2 cups prepared pancake flour  
1 cup Fat Milk diluted with  
1 cup water

Put pancake flour in mixing bowl. Stir in gradually the diluted milk. Do not beat until smooth, as overbeating toughens pancakes. The lumps are bits of shortening and will disappear in the baking. Bake on hot, slightly greased griddle until bubbles appear and edges are cooked, then turn and brown on other side. Serve with butter and syrup, honey, jelly, preserves or sausages. Makes 27 four-inch pancakes.

For Waffles, follow above recipe for pancakes, adding 3 tablespoons melted butter or other shortening just before baking. Pour about 1/4 cup of mixture into center of hot, preheated waffle maker. Close quickly and bake about 7 minutes, or until brown. Makes six 7-inch waffles.



## State Holds Huge Amount of Land

SACRAMENTO (U.P.)—Rural land equaling in area the state of Connecticut, and city subdivision lots that would form a city as large as sprawling Los Angeles have been taken over by the state for non-payment of taxes.

The California Planning Board, which disclosed these facts, announced that the state had 3,630,000 acres of tax delinquent rural land 367,000 tax delinquent subdivision lots as of 1937. Except for a small percentage of rented land, none of this property had made any contribution to the cost of government for from five to as much as fifty or more years, the board reported to Gov. Culbert Olson.

## Sewer Project Completion Due Feb. 28

"We are on the last stretch of the Vista Highlands sewer project," Glenn Jain, acting city engineer, informed the city council Tuesday night. "The work should be finished by Feb. 28 and inspections are due to begin by the end of next week."

The project provided approximately 18,500 feet of laterals on Date, Elm, Fern and Greenwood streets south of Carson street, Greenwood and on Torrance boulevard west of Fern street. The total cost of the work is reported as \$177,000 with the WPA supplying all but \$5,542 of this amount for labor and materials. Work was started on the project last July. There will be no property assessment to owners, the only cost being the usual sewer connection fee of \$25 and the expense of connection from houses to curb line.
