April 1 is Deadline for Driving Licenses Issued Early in 1929

Motorists holding licenses issued during the months of January, February, and March, 1929, have only until April 1 to get them renewed.

Director of Motor Vehicles James Carter cancelled all these "good until revoked" licenses to weed out unfit and incompetent drivers. Another block of licenses will be outlawed between April 1 and August 14, 1929, in about a month.

The issuance of "good until revoked" licenses ended after Aug. 14, 1929. Cards issued in 1927 and 1928 were cancelled several months ago. Applicants for new licenses must undergo a simple written test, a test for vision and hearing, and be free from physical defects that would prevent safe operation of motor vehicles. They also must demonstrate their ability to drive a car safely by a driving test in their own cars. There is no charge for examination or license.
