**V.F.W. Auxiliary to Complete Organization by Electing First Officers at Meeting Here Tonight**

With election of officers tonight, formation of a Torrance unit of the Ladies' Auxiliary to the Veterans of Foreign Wars will be completed here, according to Mrs. H. Darling, organizer. The local group will be affiliated with the organization that has units in every state of the Union, Hawaii, Alaska and Canal Zone.  
 Objects of this organization are fraternal, patriotic, historical and educational. It seeks to assist the Posts and members of the V.F.W. and its own members wherever possible to maintain allegiance to the government of the U. S. and fidelity to its Constitution and laws; to maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom and equal rights and justice to all men and women.  
 "Eligibility in the Auxiliary cannot be inherited, it cannot be achieved (except by nurses), but it is thrust upon women by the distinctive service of their loved ones," Mrs. Darling said. "The following have the privilege of membership:  
 Who May Join  
 Mothers, wives, widows, sister, half-sisters, daughters, foster daughters and step-daughters (not less than 16 years of age) of deceased or honorably discharged officers or enlisted men who served in the Army, Navy or Marine Corps of the United States of America, and who had foreign service in time of war or during an expedition for which a Campaign Badge has been authorized.  
 Step-mothers and step-sisters (not less than 16 years of age) (who were in this status before the service of the comrade under whom they claim eligibility) was rendered, which service would entitle the comrade to membership in the V.F.W.  
 Foster-mother and foster sisters (not less than 16 years of age), who were in this status before the service of the comrade under whom they claim eligibility was rendered, which service would entitle the comrade to membership in the V.F.W.  
 Female members of the Army Nurses' Corps, Signal Corps, United States Marine Corps, or Medical Corps of the United States Army, who have had foreign service in time of war or during a campaign or expedition of the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps of the United States of America for which a campaign badge has been authorized.

**Van de Kamp "Primps" for Easter**

**Origin, History of Traditional Hot Cross Buns Told**  
 With Easter just around the corner, Van de Kamp's Bakery stores have taken on an especially attractive and gay appearance in conformity with the colorful theme of the holiday.  
 Important in the displays which great visitors to Van de Kamp stores, are a variety of such typically Easter products as specially-decorated cakes, hot cross buns, Easter pastries, and a wide and delightful array of beautifully packed candies that appeal to the child and adult alike. There is a profusion of Easter eggs, Easter bunnies, chicks, Easter baskets, and fancy boxes for a large selection of confections that contribute so much to the pleasure of the period.  
 Those who plan to entertain at Easter time will appreciate the fine ice cream which Van de Kamp's prepare especially for this occasion in the shape of a pean roll, which is made with a chick center. These rolls are individually wrapped and sliced, making service at dessert time most convenient.  
 "We have a large number of calls from our customers asking about the origin and some of the history of hot cross buns," said Theodore J. Van de Kamp.  
 "Some research has been made on this subject and it is interesting to know that hot cross buns are presumed to have first made their appearance centuries before the Christian era, when the Egyptians prepared small bun-like loaves bearing the mark of two horns, which was an offering to their favorite moon goddess.  
 "Later on the ancient Greeks, using buns in their own religious ceremonies, changed the two horns to a cross symbolizing, to their minds, the four phases of the moon.  
 Good Luck Charm  
 "The word 'bun' itself comes from the early Greek 'boun', a sweet type of bread that was marked with a cross and used in pagan festivals. Records tell how Cecrops, the first King of Attica (Greece) offered these 'bouns' to ancient Greek gods in 1,000 B. C. Today, in museums, you can see 'hot cross buns' depicted on early Grecian works of art.  
 "Primitive Saxons, too, marked buns with a cross in honor of Easter, their goddess of light. It was her name that we eventually borrowed for our 'Easter' and we probably borrowed the venerable 'crossed bun' along with it, too.  
 "Later on, in England, the hot cross bun was believed to hold a charm. In the old days, the gentry saw to it that a hot cross bun was hung in the chimney place on Good Friday, and left there throughout the year. This was supposed to bring good luck by preventing evil spirits from ascending the chimney to ruin bread in the oven and cause other domestic troubles. It was also believed to be a guard against fire and whooping cough.  
 "Luckily, in this day and age, we simply buy our hot cross buns and eat 'em!"
