

### No Glamour in Flying Cadets' Life, Louis Says

Life as a flying cadet at Hancock College in Santa Maria has about as much glamour as a plate of Army beans—but Louis Zamperini believes that if he can learn formation flying and stunting like regular Army pilots exhibited last Sunday "I'll really feel I've lived my life."

In a letter to Robert Lewellen the noted track athlete now enlisted as a flying cadet describes his days at Hancock College as follows:

"About the only time we have to write a letter is Sunday afternoon. When I write my mother in the middle of the week it takes me three days—I spend 10 minutes a day on her letter and finish it the third day. We get up at 5:30 a. m., have 20 minutes to wash, shave and dress. After breakfast we return to barracks and make our beds and clean our floor until they are perfect and spotless.


**Chances Are Slim**  
"The bell rings and half of us go to classes until noon while the other half flies. Both groups eat lunch at the same time and then those who have been studying get in the ships and go up while the morning fliers take up book work until 4 p. m. The following hour is spent in practicing marching, drilling and then comes dinner."

"That schedule varies every other day so that we take turns flying in mornings and afternoons. Boy, some of the best men I've ever met have been getting washed out. It makes me scared to think about it. The slightest mistake and you are up for a wash (dismissal). However, they do give you a chance to prove yourself.
