Ham Rolls with Creole Sauce
Broadcast by Mary Lee Taylor April 10, 1941

- 1 cup raw rice
- 6 cups boiling water
- 1 1/2 teaspoons salt
- 2 tablespoons onion, finely cut
- 2 tablespoons bacon fat or other shortening
- 1/4 cup Fat Milk
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 12 slices ham, boiled or baked (1 pound) cut thin
- 2 tablespoons butter or other shortening

Wash and drain rice. Boil 30 minutes, or until tender in boiling water and 2 teaspoons salt. Drain and rinse in hot water. Turn on oven and set at moderately slow (350° F.). Cook onion in bacon fat 3 minutes, then add rice, milk, pepper and remaining 1/4 teaspoon salt. Continue cooking until milk is absorbed, or about 5 minutes longer. Remove from heat and cool. Then arrange mixture in center of ham slices, shaping into cylinder. Roll up and secure with tooth picks or string. Put in greased baking pan, putting bits of butter on top. Bake 20 minutes, or until thoroughly heated. Serve at once with Creole Sauce (See below). Serves 6.

Creole Sauce

- 2 tablespoons bacon shortening
- 1/4 cup finely cut green pepper
- 3 tablespoons finely cut onion
- 10 1/2-oz. can condensed tomato soup
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon milk
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 cup hot Fat Milk

Melt fat in saucepan. Add green pepper and onion and cook slowly 5 minutes. Stir in soup, salt and pepper and boil 1 minute, stirring occasionally. Then stir hot soup mixture into hot milk. Serve at once. Do not cook after mixing. Serve on Ham Rolls (See above). Serves 6.



"COLOR-STYLING" A ROOM EXPLAINED BY LOCAL PAINT AND COLOR FIRM



Yellow east wall, blue north wall, blue-green floor, and yellow and red breakfast nook make a perfect example of modern color-styling.

Color-styling a room with a paint can often work miracles in a formerly drab home, yet is really a simple and relatively inexpensive operation, according to the Torrance Paint and Wallpaper Co. at 1119 Sartori ave. And now that it has been made simpler than ever by the arrival at the local paint store of a huge album of color photos which show hundreds of beautifully decorated rooms of all types in their actual colors.

The color-styling portfolio, which will be lent by the local paint store to local residents, illustrates color-styling rules with color photos of rooms styled by America's leading decorators. The illustration reproduced above in black and white is a typical kitchen made distinctive and appealing by the use of color. The wall facing the camera is a cheery yellow, while the wall on the left is deep blue, with a circular cut-out for plants lined with a gay red. Floor is blue-green, and the breakfast nook repeats the gay red on the walls to contrast with yellow and white furniture.

Hundreds of living-room, dining-room and bedroom color schemes are also shown in the collection, as well as exterior color-styling photos. The portfolio will be available for study by anyone planning to redecorate in the coming weeks.

Veteran C.C.M.O. Workers To Be Honored In L. A.

Three veteran C. C. M. O. workers will be honored next Tuesday night when Southern California industry will pay tribute to long-time employees of many firms at a dinner in the Biltmore Bowl. Those who will attend from here are James Hitehook, foreman; M. B. Lane, foreman; and J. P. McReynolds, storekeeper.

The affair, to "publicly demonstrate Southern California industry's feeling of high esteem and loyalty towards veteran employees," will honor men who have 25 years of service. No more than 20 from any one industry will be so honored.

Easter Egg Hunt Is Saturday

The Easter egg hunt in Torrance city park and Walteria Recreation Center, sponsored by the city recreation department, will be held Saturday morning, April 12, at 10 o'clock. The Herald last week erroneously reported it was to have been held yesterday.

Dale Riley, superintendent of the department invites each child to bring two cooked and colored Easter eggs to either of the "hunt" sites. The eggs will then be deposited in a central place and slips of paper issued against them.

The paper tokens, some marked for special prizes, will be hidden. Each token will be exchangeable for an egg and, in addition, the recreation department will award special prizes for marked tokens and for the largest number found.

Smaller children will hunt inside the baseball park. Older ones will search on the outside grounds. A similar procedure will be followed at the Walteria recreation center.

Cities Ask for Larger Gasoline Tax Allocations

Resolutions from nearly every city in the county urging that larger allocations of gasoline tax funds be made to municipalities in the future by the board of supervisors are coming to the board offices. The Torrance city council has requested larger allocations.

The resolutions point out that the 45 cities of the county have 85 percent of the population and 57 percent of the primary highway mileage within their boundaries. There has been an increase in the amount of gasoline tax received by the county from the state apportionment, but cities have received no greater share, the resolutions also assert.

A new plan for distribution of these gasoline tax funds to the 45 cities has been worked out by the directors of the Los Angeles County Division of the League of Municipalities, and the supervisors are asked to make their allocations accordingly.

Whether the supervisors will accede to the requests is expected to be determined shortly, since it is a matter of policy with the supervisors, and the figure must be determined so that it may be set up in the preliminary budget now well along in preparation.
