MECHANICS OF RECALL OUTLINED

(Continued from Page 1-A)

... (8) The clerk shall within 15 days after the supplemental petition is filed, examine it, and if its certificate shows that all the signatures to the petition are still insufficient, no action shall be taken thereon. The petition remains on file and failure to secure sufficient names shall not prejudice the filing later of an entirely new petition to the same effect.

... (9) If the petition, together with supplementary petitions, if any, is sufficient, the clerk shall submit it to the city council without delay.

... (10) The council shall at once order a special election to be held not less than 35 nor more than 40 days after the date of the order, to determine whether the voters will recall the officers sought to be recalled.

Needs Majority Vote

(11) Voters at the election may state whether they wish the vacancies to be filled "by appointment or call a special election for that purpose."

(12) The vote shall be canvassed on the Monday immediately following the day of election. If the majority vote for recall, the incumbent officials shall be deemed removed from office.

(13) If the majority of voters favor filling the vacancies by election, the council shall at once order an election to be held not less than 35 nor more than 40 days after the date of the order.

(14) If a majority of the council is required, the members recalled shall retain their offices until their successors are elected and qualified. Immediately after the canvass of votes, the clerk shall call a special election, which shall be held within 30 days after the canvass of votes. The vote of the special election shall be canvassed by the clerk, who shall declare the result.
