By cool mountain streams, anglers can bid farewell to international crises, turn deaf ears to thunder over the Atlantic, and sending lines whistling through the reels, test the cunning of their casting arm since they last whipped the brooks and rivers. Trout-seekers, bent on catching the "limit", are already heading for the high country, determined to pick off the hungry risers while the season is still young.

California's outdoors, the sportsman's delight, is once more playing host to a great army of anglers. We wish 'em good luck - and full creels.

## Stewart's Record-Breaking Jump Height Topped On Same Day

Bill Stewart of Torrance is a great high jumper - all sports authorities admit that.

But Les Steers of Oregon is a greater one - and he proved it last Saturday in a Pacific Coast conference meet two hours after Bill had broken the world's record for the leap.

Competing in an invitational meet at Provo, Utah, the Torrance up-and-over youth crossed the bar at 6 ft. 10 1/2 in., on the first jump thereby breaking the world's record of 6 ft. 9 3/4 in., which was held jointly by Dave Albritton and Mel Walker of Ohio State and Cornelius Johnson of Compton J. C.

Two hours later, Pacific Coast time, Les Steers high-jumped 6 ft. 10 25-32 in. to better Stewart's mark.

The keen competition between Stewart and Steers dates back to last summer when, competing in the N. C. A. meet in Lincoln, Neb., the Oregonian took first and Stewart placed second in the junior events one afternoon and 24 hours later Steers and Stewart placed in the same order in the senior high jump event.

Mr. and Mrs. John Rogers of this city drove Stewart and four other athletes, who competed as unattached, to the Provo meet. It was a good thing for Steers that officials at the Seattle meet thought to get out the calipers for the precision measurement down to a 32nd of an inch. Because the difference between the two is eighths and 25-32nds of an inch is very close to the depth of the type heading this story. Take a look and see how skimpy that is.

The difference in the two records in one day was the sag in the bar - and no more. Both were jumping 6ft. 11 in. Both cleared. Anyone who knows anything about high jumping knows that Stewart could just as well have gone 6 ft. 10 25/32 in. as Steers did.

Stewart and Steers are scheduled to meet in the Los Angeles Coliseum May 24 in the first annual Coliseum relays. There will be no difference in time that day. The sag in the bar will be the same. And there will be added competition present so the spectators may see a seven-foot leap. The stellar high-jumpers were scheduled to meet a month ago at the Long Beach Relays but the Oregonian did not appear. Stewart was there and won with a leap of 6 ft. 7 15/16 in.

## SAN PEDRO'S TRACKSTERS CRUSH TORRANCE TARTARS

Coach Joe Berry's San Pedro high school track team enjoyed a field day Friday in rolling up an 81 to 23 victory over the Torrance Tartars in a regular Marine League meet at Torrance. The invading Pirates also captured the Class B events 83 to 12 but Coach Pete Zampierini's Class C contenders won their meet 47 to 30.

San Pedro's varsity took 10 of the 12 first places as they continued their drive toward a championship which began last week with a season-opener victory over Gardena. Narbonne is the only other undefeated varsity team in the league, having trimmed Banning Friday 77 to 27.

Two new meet records were set in Torrance. Tubby Brand of San Pedro ran the 440 in 53.4s to better Bob Bauer's mark of 53.8s set in 1939; Gerald McDonald of Torrance covered the half mile in 2m.5.5s, the former

mark of 2m. 8s. being held by Seldon Solloway, set in 1938.

The Torrance Indians were allowed but two hits last Sunday while the Highland Park Merchants pulled away with a 5-2 victory at the Torrance city park diamond.

Manager Ray Browne of the Indians had 16 men in the game. He thus introduced a lot of new baseball talent to the public for the first time. Johnny Angel Jr., business manager of the club, said that after next Sunday's game with the Los Angeles Colored Athletics, the Indians would go back to playing doubleheaders again.

## Kentucky Derby Horses to Show at Inglewood

The cream of the starters in the Kentucky Derby, scheduled to be run at Churchill Downs on May 3, will campaign in the Hollywood Park summer race meeting of 50 days which opens at the giant Inglewood plant May 23.

Kentucky Derby contestants who will be shipped to the Inglewood track include Porter's Cap, C. S. Howard's mighty three-year-old; Blue Pair, Mrs. Vera Bragg's recent expensive purchase; Woodvale Farm's Our Boots, winner of \$75,000 last year as a two-year-old; and Hugh Nesbitt's Starator, the West's darkhorse in the blue grass classic.

### Now in Training

With more than 1,000 horses now on the grounds and additional thoroughbreds arriving daily, Hollywood Park's stable area will be packed to its capacity of 1500 long before the meet opens.

Topnotchers now on hand drilling for the many rich stakes and purse awards totaling \$800,000, include such nationally famous racers as Challeon, 1939-40 turf champion; Big Pebble, winner of the \$50,000 Widener and his stablemate, Get Off, which was runnerup in the Hialeah classic; and Shining One, winner of the Hollywood Derby in 1939. All will be included among the 100 or so thoroughbreds which will be nominated for the \$75,000 Gold Cup to be run on July 19.

## Trout Outlook Good Later

Opening day for trout fishermen today found most streams in the state with a plentiful supply of water and in most cases conditions much for satisfactory conditions. Any lack of success will not mean a shortage of fish, for during the past year, the California Division of Fish and Game has planted a total of 130,000 pounds of trout, varying in size from fingerlings to fish of one and two pounds each. Possibly best results during early season will be in the lakes and reservoirs not materially affected by run-off.

Everyone over the age of 18 years will need a fishing license. Cost of a resident citizen angling license is \$2; non-resident \$3 and alien \$5. A new requirement of the California Fish and Game Commission is that the license be worn on the clothing above the waistline and in plain view.
