**Torrance Defeats Narbonne In Final Dual Track Meet of Season**

A lot of diligent study during the past week took Bill Parton, Wally Woods and Gerald MacDonald out of the ineligible class and thus enabled the Torrance varsity track team to defeat Narbonne 56 to 48 in a dual meet last Friday at Lomita. Torrance was leading by only three points up to the relay and when the Tartar squad of Parton, Woods, Russell and MacDonald took that event the Class A meet was safe for Coach Pete Zamperini's team.

Narbonne's Class B team took the meet for that division, 50 to 36, while the Torrance Cees won easily, 90 to 17. One of the Tartar squad of Parton, Woods, Russell and MacDonald took Alverado of Narbonne and Whiting of Torrance. They ran almost stride for stride until the final 50 yards when the Gaucho distance runner stepped up and beat Whiting by about 10 yards in 4:44.2. Summaries of the meet:
