Fox Theatres Cut Prices for Men in Uniform

In the spirit of cooperation with aims and purposes of the recreational campaign for members of the United States armed forces, Fox West Coast Theatres will institute special low admission prices for service men at all theatres of the circuit beginning Sunday, June 22. It was announced yesterday by Charles P. Skouras, president.

The special service men's admission range will be available, to all uniformed privates and non-commissioned officers of the Army, Navy and Marine Corps and will effect savings up to 50 per cent for them on general admissions to some 200 Fox West Coast theatres in California.

No Room For Berries; Only Planes, Guns

LONDON (U.P.)—Here is a little footnote on war-of-particular interest to housewives. It's the season for strawberries now in England, and the greenhouse kind are available. They cost twenty cents. Not 20 cents a quart, but twenty cents a berry. That would be about eight dollars for a strawberry shortcake for four people.

The hucksters are selling strawberries in the streets of America today for ten cents a quart. There would be plenty for England. But the ships that could carry them there only have space for planes and guns.

Despite the sky-high price, strawberries are about the only fresh fruit for sale anywhere in England.

Eight million oranges arrived last weekend. That's about one orange for every five people in the country. There aren't any left now.

Fresh fruits began to disappear from English markets long ago. Street peddlers stopped selling last winter. First there were no lemons. Then no oranges. Bananas and grapefruit finally disappeared.

The cargo space in the ships just can't be used for such things.

New Synthetic Auto Tires Here

A shipment of the first automobile tires made from "Ameripol" rubber, the new Goodrich synthetic developed in the laboratories of B. F.
