Chain Letters Plugging Defense Savings Stamps Hit by P. O. Authorities

The mails in all parts of the country are being flooded at the present time with letters relating to so-called endless chain schemes soliciting defense savings stamps, according to word received by Postmaster Earl Conner.

He warned patrons of the Torrance postoffice today that the sending of such matter through the mails is a violation of the postal fraud and lottery statutes. Notices are served upon persons participating in such schemes whose names come to the attention of the postoffice department requiring them to show cause why fraud orders should not be issued against them. Such orders forbid delivery of any mail to the persons named therein, Conner said.
