Representative of the younger citizens of Torrance interested in the welfare of their city, Kenneth H. Kail of 2117 Torrance Blvd., is a candidate at the special election September 10 for the city council term ending in April 1942.

Kail, who is employed in the welding department of the National Supply Co., was born in Conrad, Iowa, April 25, 1914 and graduated from high school in 1933, is married and has a two-year-old child. He has been a resident of Torrance for the past seven years.

"I am a member of the C. I. O. Oil Workers Union, interested in the working people and in helping them," Kail said this week. "I believe in knowing and letting the people know how their money is being spent and what is going on in the city of Torrance.

"I intend to bring forward the clear conscientious thinking of the younger Torrance citizens and I intend to be honest and fair in all dealing.

"In addition to endorsing the city's civil service ordinance, I also favor and will work for an adequate just pension system for city workers eligible to receive such benefits. After all, when a man has given the best years of his life to his community, he deserves something more than a letter of commendation when age makes it necessary to replace him," Kail concluded.

Figures Show Rapid Gain in Population

SACRAMENTO—The Department of Motor Vehicles has made public the results of a survey crediting California with a gain of 566,351 in population since Census Bureau figures were announced in April of last year.

The estimate gives the state a total population of 7,473,738 as of July 1, 1941 compared with the 1940 Census Bureau figure of 6,907,387. The annual rate of increase was given as 8.2 or four times greater than the normal rate.

The population of Los Angeles County for July 1, 1941 was given as 3,049,478.

The Census Bureau estimate for 1940 was 2,785,643, a gain of 263,835 or 9.5 percent.

The Department's study, made by Victor W. Killick, chief of the Bureau of Statistics, was based on motor vehicle registrations. Only fee paid private passenger autos registered were used in making the estimate.

The bulk of the increase was ascribed to the national defense program, which has brought large numbers of additional people and motor cars to California.


