Why Not A Cobbler? By Frances Lee Barton. "WHAT shall we have for dessert?" Why not a cobbler - a peach cobbler while fresh peaches are in season, or even with canned peaches? This is a change from the usual dessert - and a very delightful change at that.

3 tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca; 1 cup sugar; 1/4 teaspoon salt; 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg; 2 tablespoons melted butter; 2 cups canned sliced peaches, drained; 1 cup sliced juice; 1 tablespoon lemon juice. 2 cups sifted cake flour; 2 teaspoons double-acting baking powder; 1/2 teaspoon salt; 6 tablespoons butter or other shortening; 1/2 cup milk. Combine tapioca, sugar, salt, nutmeg, butter, peaches, and fruit juices; let stand 15 minutes, or while crust is being made or sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift again. Cut in shortening. Add milk all at once and stir carefully until all flour is absorbed. Then stir vigorously until mixture forms a soft dough and follows spoon around bowl. Turn out immediately on slightly floured board and knead 30 seconds. Roll 1/2 of dough into strip, 3 inches wide and 1/4 inch thick; line sides of 8 x 8 1/2-inch pan. Bake in hot oven (450° F.) 15 minutes; then reduce heat to moderate (350° F.) and bake 15 to 20 minutes longer. Sprinkle powdered sugar over top, if desired. Serve &.
