Hearing on Slough Drainage Project Being Arranged

Arrangements are being made by Pat MacDonnell, secretary of the Gardena Valley Chamber of Commerce, for a public hearing by U. S. Army engineers on the Hedger alternate survey for Nigger Slough drainage, a project estimated to cost about \$1,750,000. MacDonnell was asked by the Army engineers to plan such a hearing and preside at it. He said today that the arrangements are not complete as yet and will be announced next Thursday. The Nigger Slough drainage plan has been approved as a PWA project and is less expensive than a so-called permanent solution of the flood conditions that periodically swamp a large area in and near Torrance and Gardena.
