Lack of Steel Forces Shutdown of Lomita Storm Drain Project

Inability to obtain reinforcing steel has forced the shutdown of the Lomita boulevard storm drain project, County Engineer Alfred Jones disclosed this week. Jones said that since the shut-down, local WPA officials had informed him that they could not get any men to reopen the project, should the steel become available. The county was unable to get the job certified as a defense project.

About one mile of the drain was built, westerly from Bixby slough toward the Lomita business district. About another half mile will have to be constructed before it can be of any material benefit to the Lomita district, Jones said.

Under way for about 15 months, the work has been slow because about three-fourths mile of the drain was built as a tunnel, eight feet square, extending as deep as 50 feet beneath the surface. The end of the drain is to be a depression where flood waters pond during rainstorms.

This water now flows slowly to the northeast of the business district into Bixby slough, but engineers found they could shorten the project by more than a mile by tunneling through to the east. There are no defense factories in the flooded areas, but highway travel is inconvenienced, engineers said.


