New Women's Service Corps Forming Here

Formation of a Torrance unit of the American Women's Voluntary Service will begin Monday with registration of volunteers at 1334 1/2 E. Third (adjoining The Torrance Herald office). It was announced today by Mrs. Pat Dillinger, 2468 Torrance blvd. She has been named chairman of the unit by Mrs. Vida Reed Stone, field representative for Southern California.

The A. W. V. S. was formed, according to Mrs. Dillinger, to answer the need for women to find their place in the defense program and community service. Its function is to establish units which will train volunteers for government defense agencies and municipal departments and existing health and welfare organizations. The purpose is to supplement, not supplant, the work of existing organizations.

"Our organization offers basic courses in first aid, nutrition, physical fitness, air raid precautions, transportation, emergency feeding, communications, control of fear and panic," the local chairman said. "Tests and certificates are given at the close of each course. All courses are free. Age is not a handicap in the A. W. V. S. There is a place for all from grandmothers down to Sister Sue. Older women have a choice of a number of activities in which their efforts will be particularly helpful."

Every volunteer will be classified according to previous experience, special interest and number of hours available to serve. Evening classes may be arranged for those regularly employed and those who cannot be spared from their homes will be accommodated with work to do without leaving their residences.
