Co. Congressional Group Concerned With Coast Safety

Assurance that Los Angeles county's entire Congressional delegation is concerned about the safety of the coastal area was given in a letter to the board of supervisors this week from Senator Sheridan Downey. Daily sessions are held by the county delegation of seven congressmen and two senators, Downey said. The 17th district, embracing Torrance, Lomita, Redondo Beach and the Palos Verdes area, has no Congressman since the death of Lee Geyer of Gardena, but his post will be filled this fall.

Air Markers on Buildings Blacked Out

Removal of all air markers atop buildings in this community was being accomplished this week, at request of the Civil Aeronautics Authority. Notification from Secretary of War stated that "names of towns, cities and communities, together with directional markings on top of buildings and other structures within combat zones" were to be "defaced or obliterated at once."

World Prayer Day Tomorrow

All arrangements for local observance of the World Day of Prayer tomorrow (Friday) at the First Baptist church were complete today. The national devotional has been planned as a Protestant effort to meet world conditions with an expressed desire for peace. The program, which is being jointly sponsored by the pastors of the Baptist, Methodist, Central Evangelical and Christian churches, will begin at 11 o'clock with a one-hour prayer service.
