Immunization of All Children Goal for 'Child Health Day', May 1

In response to President Roosevelt's appeal to communities throughout the nation to contribute towards the complete defeat of diphtheria and smallpox, County Health Officer Dr. Wil-

ton L. Halverson, reports the County Health Department is actively cooperating with other health agencies in a widespread immunization campaign. The goal is to have every child over nine months of age immunized against smallpox and diphtheria before Child Health Day, May 1. Smallpox and diphtheria, enemies of childhood, are both preventable thru immunization. An advise county health officials, in peace times, parents could do much toward keeping their children from being exposed to contagious diseases. In war times, this is not so easy to do. Wise parents are advised to consider the possibility of enemy action which might thrust them and their children suddenly into new surroundings where the danger of contagion is much greater and the chance of avoiding it much less.
