Trout Season

Opens Tomorrow

Trout season opens tomorrow, May 1, with sunrise scheduled at 6:05 W.M. On that day it is expected that 100,000 fishermen will be on the streams and lakes of California with the outlook for the opening very promising in most sections. Indications are that there will be little high water, and the snow pack is about normal. Heavy stocking of streams and lakes in Southern California and the Inyo-Mono area should assure fishermen of excellent sport on opening days.

The list of closed streams and lakes, issued by the State Fish and Game Division, is practically the same as last year. Fishermen are urged to purchase their 1942 angling licenses today, to avoid the usual rush at this time and perhaps disappointment at not being able to obtain a license. A resident fishing license costs \$2 and the limit of trout is 25 fish or ten pounds and one fish.

Official Fish and Game reports on nearby streams follow:

Kern County—Poso Creek, White River, Cedar and Bull Run will be high, but bait fishing should be fair. Roads to these streams are in good condition. Basin Creek should be clear but high. Kern River high.

Southern California, Ventura County—Late rains have raised the water level in the streams and good fishing is anticipated for the first of May. Los Angeles County streams holding up. Many heavily planted with catchable sized trout. Orange County streams are in normal flow. San Diego County—Expected city lakes will remain closed to angling. No anglers will be permitted to go down Hawser Creek from the Moreno Dam as in past years. Those fishing this creek will have to go down the Mine Creek Road to the creek. Waters clear and fishing should be generally good. Clear water in Pine, In-

dian and Noble creeks. Mono-Inyo Area. Water and fishing conditions look very favorable for the opening in most of the streams in the Owens Valley, but the river is high now and might not slow down. Convict Lake open now and all roads in Long Valley to the river and Crowley Lake, All lakes expected to be accessible but Lundy, Virginia and possibly the Mammoth lakes.

Tulare County, South Fork of Tule in fair condition. Water clear and not too high for good fishing. Bait recommended. A small fee is charged by the Indians on the Tule Indian reservation. Middle Fork Tule should provide good fishing in the lower reaches. North Fork Tule may be somewhat high. Smaller streams clear.
