Be on the safe side—register your automobile tire serial numbers with the Torrance police. The voluntary registration began Monday and will continue as long as local residents appear with the correct numbers of their rubber, according to Police Chief John Stroh.

Automobile owners should be prepared to furnish the serial numbers and make of all tires on their machines and any others they own.

More than 10,000 tires will be registered, it was expected. The registration file will be used to check stolen tires and tires on the machines of suspicious-acting drivers.

Ameche, Bennett Score Hit in 'Confirm or Deny'
