Permanent Dim-Out Warning Placards To Be Posted Soon

Permanent "dim-out" signs—beaded on a pressed wood material to reflect approaching headlights—are scheduled to be set in place within the next few days along the southland coastal State Highways by the signposting department of the Automobile Club.

Replacing the emergency cardboard signs which were posted when dim-out regulations first went into effect, the permanent markers will bear the same warning to motorists: "Restricted light zone. At night reduce speed; use parking lights."

The signs will be placed in areas designated by the State Highway Department where headlights of motor vehicles must be dimmed to prevent light beams which might silhouette ships at sea.

Tire Rationing Rules Amended

An amendment to the tire rationing regulations which tightens requirements in some respects and extends eligibility for tires to certain automobile users heretofore not provided for, has been issued by the Office of Price Administration.

The amendment does the following things:

1. Requires that a vehicle operated by a physician, surgeon, farm veterinarian or practicing minister, to be eligible for tires and tubes, must be used "exclusively" for professional services or religious duties instead of "principally" as heretofore.

2. Makes licensed chiropractors and osteopaths eligible under the same conditions as apply to doctors of medicine.

3. Extends the eligibility of ministers to "any religious practitioner qualified to administer to the religious needs of the members of a congregation."

4. Changes the designation of nurses eligible for tires from "visiting nurses" to "public health nurses."

5. Extends eligibility for re-capped tires to public school officials and teachers for necessary transportation between schools.

Motor Costs Rise With High Speed

The cost per mile of operating an automobile is twice as great at 65 miles per hour as at 40.

The cost per mile at 40 miles per hour was declared to be about 2½ cents. At 65 per hour it is twice that sum.
