Columbia Discontinues Operations of Tin Plate Mill at Pittsburg

To conserve critical war materials, the government has directed another 25 per cent decrease in the rate of production of tin plate to be effective over the fourth quarter of 1942.

The latest directive would put Columbia's tin mill operation at only 37 1/2 per cent of capacity which, due to increasing difficulties in maintaining satisfactory work schedules, would be an impractical operation, officials report.

Army to Finish Jap Evacuation Job by Nov. 1

Transfer of all persons of Japanese ancestry from strategic military areas on the West Coast will be completed by Nov. 1, Lieut. Gen. J. L. DeWitt, Commanding General, Western Defense Command and Fourth Army, announced yesterday.

Relics of Early Voyage Found at Drake's Bay

Material evidence of Sebastian Rodriguez Cermeño's exploration in 1595 has been uncovered near Drake's Bay by University of California anthropologists.

In an effort to identify remains of an ancient Indian village as to tribe and age, excavations were undertaken during a two-year period by the Department of Anthropology, who searched for material objects whose historical date could be recognized.

Hand-forged iron spikes and fragments of sixteenth-century Chinese porcelain found while examining the site have been identified as relics salvaged from Cermeño's wrecked ship, the San Augustin, which was driven aground in Drake's Bay in November, 1595.

Army Air Forces Want Men For Limited Military Service

Technicians, mechanics and radio repair men between the ages of 18 and 50 who are not physically qualified for general military duty (1-A) but are acceptable for limited military service (1-B), are now eligible for employment as air corps specialists, it was announced this week at headquarters of Maj. Gen. Ralph P. Cousins at West Coast Army Air Forces Training Center in Santa Ana.

Extension of age limits to include men up to 50 years and a liberal broadening of the physical standards is expected to augment greatly the enlistment of aircraft mechanics, armorers, radio mechanics, radio operators, metal workers, welders and other trained technicians and ground crew workers needed by the Army Air Forces.


The physical requirements for limited military service under the 1-B Classification permit the enlistment of applicants with certain deficiencies in weight, chest measurements; certain types of defective vision and partial blindness correctable to

officer or technical ratings, and rapid promotion may be expected.

Pay scales range from \$50 a month for a private to \$138 a month for a master sergeant, with those on flying status drawing 50 per cent extra base pay. In addition there are family allowances for men with dependents. Soldier's expenses, including quarters, food, clothing, medical care and on-the-job training are paid, the announcer said.

Hiring Rate for Women High in Some Factories

Following Paul V. McNutt's recent declaration that before another year 30 per cent of all jobs in American war industry will be filled by women, comes a report from the Bureau of Occupations at U. C. L. A. that the hiring rate for women in Southern California is already as high as 65 per cent in some airplane plants.

"From a quarter to two-thirds of all jobs being filled at airplane factories are taken by women," says Mildred Foreman, manager of the bureau. "We have some way to go before catching up to England, where it has been reported, 85 per cent of the airplane workers and 35 percent of the shipyard are women."
