Synthetic Rubber: BUNA S. WILL BE MAIN SOURCE OF AUTO TIRES

With one of the nation's largest synthetic rubber plants rising right on the hem of the outskirts of Torrance it's a safe bet that few local residents know what the product is that will be produced here.

"People speak glibly of synthetic rubber—just what is that substitute that we hope will be available to people like you and me some time in 1944?"

It is a substance known in the rubber trade as Buna S. It is made by combining two other materials, butadiene and styrene. Both of these are derived through chemical processes com- plicated to the layman. Buta- diene can be made from either alcohol or petroleum; hence the interest of the oil companies and the farmers in synthetic rubber.

Petroleum Method Cheaper
Behind the alcohol lies grain, molasses and other products. The plant investment to produce syn- thetic rubber from alcohol or oil is about the same, namely, \$300 per ton-year capacity. How-

State War Plants Need 250,000 New Workers In 1943

More than 250,000 new work- ers will be needed in California war plants during the next year, Herbert M. Huff, chairman of the state defense council's labor supply committee, declared today.

Thirty per cent of the 1,000,000 workers needed in the San Francisco area will be women, he said. Southern California air- craft plants need 150,000 work- ers, 75,000 of them to be women. Persons in less essential in- dustries will be urged to trans- fer to war jobs, being replaced by women where possible. It is expected that employers will at- tempt to draw workers from the state's reserve rather than to import labor.
