**Microfilming of City Records Would Cost \$300, Council Told**

**Mayor to Ask For Deferments**

Because the fire and police departments are being depleted by enlistments in the armed services, Councilman George V. Powell asked the council Nov. 24 to authorize the mayor to "intercede with the draft board if any member of those departments or any other essential city worker is about to be drafted and ask for their deferment." The motion was approved.

To date, only three city employees have been inducted by Selective Service: Sherman Miller, bus driver; Cecil Powell, son of the councilman, water department worker, and Judge John A. Shidler.

Fire Chief J. E. McMaster was authorized to employ two additional firemen, full time on temporary appointment for the emergency, after he had reported his force was down to eight paid men working two shifts.

**Final Cost to City for \$175,000 Sewer May be Only \$6,620**

The ultimate cost of the \$175,000 sewer project in Vista Highland to the city of Torrance may be approximately \$6,620, instead of \$4,868 which City Engineer Glenn Jain figures is due the municipality from the \$5,542 deposited by the W. P. A. to guarantee payment of the city's expenses toward the Federal project.

The County Flood Control District has repeatedly rejected the city's claim for \$4,868 for use of city trucks, labor and engineering services. Jain reported to the council Nov. 24, and the county has filed a claim for \$2,251 out of the Federal deposit.

claims whereby the city would receive 68 per cent of its bill or \$3,800. This would make the total cost of the \$175,000 project about \$6,620—which the council agreed was a very good deal and approved the settlement plan.

**Law on Handling Gas Connections Asked**

Adoption of an ordinance regulating the turning on or making re-connections of gas mains here was suggested to the city council Nov. 24 by the Southern California Gas Co. to avoid possible injury and property damage. The company said such work should be done only by its trained workers and reported that a number of Southland cities have such a law. The suggestion was referred to the ordinance committee.

**Mary Lee Taylor's Cranberry Chiffon Pie**  
Broadest Dec. 2nd

1/2 cup Per Milk  
22 two-inch vanilla wafers  
2 cups fresh cranberries  
7/8 cup sugar

1/4 teaspoon salt  
1 package lemon-flavored gelatin  
3/4 cup boiling water

Chill milk until icy cold. Rub a deep 9-inch pie pan with vegetable oil. Then line bottom and sides of pan with vanilla wafers. Wash cranberries, dry on towel, then put through medium knife of food chopper, or chop in wooden bowl. Mix together ground cranberries, sugar, water and salt. Heat to boiling. Chill while preparing the following: Dissolve gelatin in boiling water. Chill until slightly thickened, then add cold cranberry mixture and continue chilling until thick and syrupy. Whip chilled milk with rotary egg beater, or electric beater at high speed, until stiff. Fold into gelatin mixture. Put in wafer-lined pan. Chill until firm. If desired, garnish with sweetened, cooked cranberries just before serving.

\*The same amount of chilled, canned cranberry sauce, cut into 1/4-inch cubes, may replace fresh cranberries if sugar, water and salt are omitted. Fold diced sauce into syrupy gelatin mixture.
