Eight (8) hours shall constitute a day's work; it being understood that in the event that workmen are employed less than eight (8) hours per day, the per diem wages shall be deemed to be that fraction of the per diem wages here established that the number of hours of employment bears to eight (8) hours.

Stardom was a cinch for the red-headed beauty, who is costarred with Robert Young in M-G-M's "Cairo," starting Sunday at the Plaza theatre in Hawthorne. But life as a chorus girl was something else again. For instance, her first heartbreak cost \$6.95 in cash but a million dollars in injured feelings.

She had just found work as a chorine through the efforts of her sister Blossom. Jeanette's funds were low but her hopes were high. When she appeared for rehearsals in cotton undies, the other chorus girls almost booed her out of the theatre. Six dollars and ninety-five cents from her first pay check went for a "teddy"—a fancy one, too, resplendent with ribbons, rosettes, and lace.

Her latest picture, "Cairo" is not strictly a musical (although she sings several numbers) but rather an adventure story of today's headlines.

Pedestrian Death Data Disclosed

For every 13 pedestrians injured in traffic accidents in the city of Los Angeles, one death results, according to 1942 traffic statistics.

Pedestrians are five times as apt to be fatally injured when struck by an automobile as persons involved in other types of accidents, the report shows. Whereas only 13 persons have been injured for each death in pedestrian accidents, the ratio for other types of traffic accidents is 74-to-1.
