A public sale of tax delinquent real property in the City of Torrance will be held in the Torrance City Hall beginning on the 12th of April, 1943, at 7:30 P.M. Sale will be conducted in the Council Chambers. Properties will remain on sale until sold, or until termination of sale by the Council.

On and after the 5th day of April, 1943, a list of the various properties to be sold will be posted in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance. The list will also show the minimum resale price and other information, such as name of record owner and the size of the parcels of land to be sold. Maps showing the location of the various properties will also be on exhibit.

All properties (being approximately 400 in number) will in every instance be delivered free of all existing real estate taxes and, with few exceptions, free of all assessments and bonds. No further general real estate taxes will be due on any of the properties until November, 1944.

While the City Council prefers that all sales be made for cash and will, therefore, give preference to cash bids, nevertheless, purchasers may buy upon terms of 20% down at the time of sale, balance to be paid in not to exceed 8 installments—each installment to be for an amount not less than 10% of the total sale price. Monthly payments must be made on or before every Thirtieth (30th) day succeeding the date the property is sold. No interest will be charged on unpaid balances.
