Seven Dens of Cub Scouts Formed in This Area for Younger Boys

Following the completion of the organization of seven dens of Cubs, juvenile division of the Boy Scouts of America, Charles A. Hatfield of 25305 Narbonne ave., has been named cubmaster for this area. He expects that the membership will soon reach twice that many Dens composed of youngsters between the ages of 9 and 11 years of age.

Hatfield, a San Pedro postoffice clerk, is enthusiastic regarding his assignment. The Cub program prepares the boys too young for active Scout membership for the more intensive work when they affiliate with older boys.

A meeting last Wednesday evening, Ralph Alexander of the Los Angeles division of the Boy Scouts of America and George P. Thatcher of WALTERIA, who has been assigned the territory comprising Lomita, Walteria and Torrance, spoke and aided materially in the organization of the younger boys.

Both expressed gratification at Hatfield's acceptance of the Cubmaster position, and pledged their aid in the carrying out of the extensive program.

Den Mothers Named Hatfield will have as his assistants William Bean, Martin Whitmer, Mann Flint and Bert Rea, assistant Cubmasters. Each den of Cubs is in charge of a Dene-age group, and the women named for this important part of the activity are Mrs. Dorothy Bean, 25323 Walnut st.; Mrs. Almee Graves, 1851 247th st.; Mrs. Irene Rolfe, 1823 247th st.; Mrs. Martha Hansen, 25034 Cypress ave.; Mrs. A. Nauty, 25007 Cypress st.; Mrs. Herman Graf, 2129 W. 25th st.; and Mrs. H. E. Crum, 2318 247th st. Each Den meets weekly at the home of the Den Mother, while the Pack which is the name given the entire group, has a monthly meeting at the home of the Cubmaster with the Den Mothers and assistant Cubmasters in attendance to work out plans.

The Cubbing program provides activity for the boys in the three-age groups of Cubs, the nine-year-olds being designated as Wolves, ten-year-olds as Bears and 11-year-old boys as Lions. Thatcher, who recently moved to Walteria, will supervise the activity for the area.
