**Los Angeles County Expected to  
Benefit by Post-War Rail Program**

Los Angeles county, which has an important stake in the nation's huge travel business, is one of the regions of the country that should benefit considerably as a result of the aggressive post-war plans of the competing factors in the transportation industry. Railway Age, reporting a survey of railroad executives in its current issue, says that the railroads are going out vigorously after more business when the war is over. The executives interviewed unanimously declared their intention of "doing everything in their power" to make railroad travel far more attractive to the public.

At perhaps the most alert and foresighted point in their history, the railroads are now blueprinting new, lightweight, streamlined trains, more luxurious cars to increase the fun of travel, high-capacity, low-fare cars and generally reduced passenger rates, the survey shows. To top it all off, the rail chiefs look forward to a vigorous merchandising and advertising program.

That the railroad industry is making these plans is good news for all the areas of the country which share substantially in the prosperity of the travel business, and good news for all Americans who love to travel.

Sure winners in the post-war traffic will be areas like ours where the appeal to the travel instinct is great.

**Rubber Conserved  
By Greyhound Lines**

Intercity buses carrying more than one-half of the total number of passengers traveling between cities, use only six per cent of the crude rubber, and only two and one-half per cent of the motor fuel consumed by all commercial vehicles, according to F. W. Ackerman, vice president of Pacific Greyhound Lines, in quoting from a comprehensive study of wartime transportation problems recently made by the National Association of Motor Bus Operators.

Continuing, Mr. Ackerman stated, "Bus operators have been pioneers in rubber conservation, and the intercity business average better than 40 thousand miles per tire, with many tires giving 75 thousand miles of wear. Even with this large mileage, when replaced for safety reasons, each bus tire still has enough rubber which can be reclaimed to make several passenger car tires."

**Memorial Flag  
Will be Given  
By Navy Dept.**

In tribute to a man or woman who dies in the service of the Navy, Marine Corps or Coast Guard, a free memorial flag is now furnished the next of kin, according to an announcement by 11th Naval District officials. This flag is issued to one person only, normally the one listed next of kin of the deceased. Under other specific arrangements, however, it may be turned over to some other person or to an organization.

Naval officials revealed the ways by which the flag may be obtained.

If the body is sent home for interment, a flag accompanies it under authorization of the commanding officer of the activity or vessel where death occurred. Where it is impracticable for a flag to be dispatched in time for the funeral, the Veterans' Administration furnishes one for the ceremony, afterward turning it over to the next of kin.

The Veterans' Administration is then reimbursed by the Navy, Marine Corps or Coast Guard. In all other cases, including burial at sea the next of kin may request a flag from the Bureau of Ships, Navy Department; Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps, or Headquarters, U.S. Coast Guard.

**Ration Procedure  
Shortened by New  
Directive of OPA**

The O.P.A. has announced a consolidation of registration procedure for obtaining rationed foods for industrial use which will be of interest in the Torrance and Lomita areas.


Under the new arrangement, all industrial users will register with the O.P.A. between Dec. 15 and Jan. 5. They will use a single form and make application for food allotments under all rationed programs at one time. Previously three registrations were necessary under the sugar, processed foods and meat-fat programs.

At the same time the O.P.A. announced that applications for industrial food for the remainder of 1943 must be filed before Dec. 15 to facilitate the new registration.

**Cork Oak Plantings  
75,000 In Two Years**

Nearly 75,000 cork oak trees have been planted in California in the past two years, and California cork has proven to be "fully equal in quality to that imported from the Mediterranean region," it was reported today by Woodbridge Metcalf, extension forester of the University of California agricultural extension service.

Metcalf said a cork oak distribution program is under way in the state, with state rangers distributing 100,000 cork oak seedlings to "authorized applicants in various counties."

He added that approximately 9000 pounds of cork oak acorns have been collected and about 10 tons of cork stripped from California trees.

The California crop and livestock reporting service of the federal and state departments of agriculture announced today that indications for the California bean crop as of Nov 1 were for 5,332,000 bags, or about 226,000 less than earlier forecasts.



**Family Allowance  
Scheduled for Men  
in Armed Services**

The recent Congressional act, increasing family allowances for wives and families of servicemen, is what is designated as Class "A." The husband or father in the service contributed \$22, the government \$28, making a total of \$50 monthly. The government adds \$30 for the first child, making a total of \$80. For the second child the government contributes \$20, bringing the total to \$100. For each additional child the government puts up \$20. A family consisting of a wife and five children, for illustration, would become beneficiaries to the amount of \$160 monthly.

A divorced wife and one child gets \$72 monthly, \$22 from her ex-spouse and \$50 from the government.

**Women Accepted In  
Waves up to Age 49**

Wives of Navy enlisted men, heretofore barred from enlisting in the Navy's Women's Reserve, may now join the WAVE, opening a patriotic avenue to thousands of women between the ages of 20 and 49.

Local announcement of this change in requirements was made today by Rear Adm. I. C. Johnson, U.S.N., (ret.) Eleventh Naval District director of Naval Officer Procurement.

"The only exception is that wives of officers of the rank of ensign or above are not eligible," the admiral said. "However, thousands of qualified women who are Navy-minded now have the opportunity to join their husbands in navy blue."
