Mrs. Griffin was the mother of Miss Clementina de Forest Griffin, former principal of Narbonne high school. She was the widow of George Butler Griffin, pioneer Los Angeles newspaper publisher. She was well known in Torrance as she often visited her daughter here while Miss Griffin had charge of Narbonne high school. She leaves three other daughters.

Hospital Missionary Reports to Church

The Church of Christ missionary to the Los Angeles county hospital, John Teferfeller, visited the Torrance congregation last Sunday. The Torrance Church of Christ sponsors Mr. Teferfeller in the work among members of the church who are patients in the hospital.

In a recent report he described his work to the 70-odd Southern California congregations of this church. The contact with the patient begins when a file card regarding the church preference of the incoming patient is given him, Teferfeller said.

Twice weekly Church of Christ patients are visited and on Sundays the Lord's Supper is served to those desiring it, the report stated.

A follow-up of patients consists of direct correspondence and contact with the minister nearest their residence. By this means personal guidance can be given these people who often are recently from another part of the country and have not located a congregation of the Church of Christ in this section.


