Lt. Com. Morgan, USNR, Awarded Legion of Merit

Lt. Comdr. Charles C. Morgan, U.S.N.R., former industrial engineer at Pittsburg (Calif.) works of Columbia Steel Company, has been awarded the Legion of Merit, his second decoration in the past five months for gallantry as commanding officer of a destroyer transport in the South Pacific.

Commander Morgan, 33-year-old Annapolis graduate, who left his position of industrial engineer of Pittsburg works in April, 1941, to return to active service with the Navy, was awarded the Silver Star Medal by Admiral W. F. Halsey last November.

The newest citation, accompanying the award, which was also signed by Admiral Halsey, read as follows:

"For exceptionally meritorious conduct in the performance of outstanding service while serving as Commanding Officer of a destroyer transport operating in the Solomon Islands area during the period from July 13 to Nov. 21, 1943. The ship under the command of Lt. Comdr. Morgan took part in the transporting and landing of troops and supplies during operations against New Georgia, Vella Lavella, Treasury and Bougainville Islands, and participated in the bombardment of enemy installations as well as performing escort and reconnaissance duty. Despite the difficulties inherent in the age of the ship, and of navigating unfamiliar and poorly charted waters while under persistent attack by all weapons of the enemy, he successfully accomplished the missions with which he was entrusted. His conduct throughout was in keeping with the highest traditions of the United States Naval Service."

Lt. Comdr. Morgan graduated from the U. S. Naval Academy in 1933 and served as a line officer with the Navy until 1939 when he started with Columbia Steel Company. He is married and the father of three children. His family, for the duration of the war, is living at New Bethlehem, Pa.



Mayor Raymond V. Darby Inspects North American's Mighty Mustang



RAYMOND V. DARBY, mayor of Inglewood and candidate for supervisor, is shown with the "fastest thing on wings"—North American's mighty Mustang (made in Inglewood), which has been officially declared the fastest airplane in the world today. Mr. Darby's son, First Lieut. Raymond V. Darby, Jr., pilots one of these amazing fighter planes in the combat area over India. Lieutenant Darby also wears a microphone around his throat which was made in the Inglewood plant of the Universal Microphone Company.

Postwar planning is more than a slogan to Mayor Raymond V. Darby of Inglewood, who is a candidate for supervisor in the fourth supervisory district—it is with him the most important long range project before public administrators today. For the mayor has two sons in service, one of them a pilot of a North American-made Mustang, now in service in the India theatre of war, and another who is an aviation cadet.

He doesn't want these boys, or thousands of others, coming home to a nation unaware of their plight and unappreciative of their services. He doesn't want them to have to look forward to selling apples for a living, as did members of the bonus army in 1932.

Instead, the mayor proposes for this county a pool of public works projects which will provide gainful employment for all veterans who have been rehabilitated before being returned to their civil life activities.

Employees Must Show Registration Cards

All Los Angeles County employees will be required to show their draft registration cards, following action of the Board of Supervisors at a recent meeting in order to determine if there are any slackers among them, according to Supervisor Oscar Haug.

Department heads will be required to inspect the cards and the County Civil Service Commission has been directed to require display of draft cards by all applicants for county positions.

Gas Pipeline From Goleta Field Given Approval by WPB

Construction of a major pipeline from the La Goleta dry gas field above Santa Barbara to Los Angeles has been approved by the WPB.

The project, which will be undertaken by Southern Counties Gas Company, Southern California Gas Company and the Pacific Lighting Corporation, is expected to cost about \$4,000,000.

The Pacific Lighting Company owns the La Goleta dry gas field, where an underground gas storage operation of considerable magnitude has been in progress for the past three years. The new pipelines, according to preliminary plans submitted to WPB, will provide a net increase of 164,000,000 cubic feet of gas for peak day use by essential customers in the Los Angeles area.

Order for the necessary pipe has just been placed by the companies involved and commencement of the job is dependent on when it can be delivered.

The project, it is explained by P. W. Walters, southern division manager of the Southern California Gas Company, will enable the gas companies in Southern California to store large volumes of surplus gas in the natural underground reservoir at La Goleta during the summer months when surplus gas is available and utilize this gas to meet peak loads in the winter-time.

Salvation Army Here Needs Used Articles

Letters from servicemen overseas tell of the friendly hand of the Salvation Army, which follows the Army and the Navy to all corners of the world. One recent letter received in Torrance spoke of a "hidden battery" of Salvation Army doughnut machines on an Italy beach-head.

The local branch of the welfare organization this week renewed its appeal to residents of the area to give any old articles of furniture, clothing or similar items for which they no longer have use to the Salvation Army, to assist it in financing its many activities.

Primary Candidates May Get Extra Gas

Special gasoline rations may be obtained by candidates for public office who have qualified for the primary election, it was announced by Frank Balthis, Jr., district OPA director.

"Qualified candidates can obtain gasoline allotments providing they use it for bona fide campaign purposes and no alternate means of public transportation is available," Balthis declared.

In addition Balthis pointed out that campaign managers and others connected with candidates are not entitled to such rations.




