### Army Plans No Restriction on '44 Deer Hunts

Replying to an inquiry from George P. Miller, executive secretary of the state division of fish and game, relative to possible restrictions placed on deer hunting during the 1944 season, Col. C. K. Wing writes:

"Your letter of March 24, 1944, to General Emmons, Commanding General of Western Defense Command, concerning possible closing of certain areas of California to deer hunting for the season of 1944, has been referred to this headquarters for reply. The reason for forwarding your letter is that since the deer hunting season of 1943, the responsibility of making such decisions has been transferred to Gen. D. McCoach, Jr., Commanding General of Ninth Service Command.

"I am instructed by General McCoach to state that there is no restriction on hunting contemplated for the state of California for the season 1944."

For the past two years deer hunting has been prohibited in some parts of the state for military reasons and the season was very much reduced in other parts. The curtailment of hunting has led to an unchecked increase in deer herds beyond normal, with the result that complaints of farmers on deer damage have been numerous. If the regular open season on deer, as provided for by the fish and game code, is permitted this year, it will go a long way towards alleviating this deer damage problem.

At its meeting in March, the fish and game commission went on record as favoring the regular open deer season this year.
