### Rubber Director Sees Big Future

industry as well as the plantations will be taxed to capacity for years after the year to meet demands for rubber products, which will far exceed requirements before Pearl Harbor.

In an effort to bring about further rubber conservation, Dewey urged that drivers proceed at low speed, particularly in hot weather, that they share their cars, that they keep tires inflated properly, that they avoid chuckholes, that they repair small tire damages, that they recap—not once but again and again.

He pledged that by June, 1944, improved camelback will be available for recapping all types of tires, ration-free. Stressing manpower shortages, he said Los Angeles county tire plants are turning out only 9600 tires a day although machinery and materials are capable of producing 13,000.

Need Technicians "It is necessary," he stated, "that changing policies of the draft do not drain from this industry its highly skilled technicians and key production men."

"Well, now, it's like this," Joe replied. "I see by the Torrance Herald that Ex-councilman Vern Babcock was defeated by one vote. I see by the Post-Dispatch that a council candidate there was two votes behind until they counted the 24 absentee ballots.

Then he found himself six votes ahead and elected.

"Now, here's what gets me: Every once in a while around election time you hear somebody say, 'No, I didn't vote, but my vote wouldn't make any difference anyway.' But here you have an example of what one or two dozen votes can do in an election. Everybody should register and everybody should vote."

### RATIONING REMINDERS

Meats, fats, etc.—Book 4 red stamps A8, B8, C8, D8, E8, F8, G8, H8, J8, K8, L8, M8, N8, P8, Q8 now valid and remain good indefinitely.

Processed foods—Book 4 blue stamps A8, B8, C8, D8, E8, F8, G8, H8, J8 and K8 now valid and good indefinitely.

Sugar—Book 4 stamps 30 and 31 valid for five pounds indefinitely; stamp 40 good for five pounds for home canning through Feb. 28, 1945.

Shoes—Book 1 stamp 18 valid through April 30, Book 3 airplane stamp 1 good indefinitely. Stamp 2 valid May 1.

Gasoline—11-A coupons good for three gallons through June 21. B2, B3, C2 and C3 coupons good for five gallons.
