July 4 Pageant To Exceed Those Of Past Years

American Legion County Council officials announced today that the display of Fourth of July fireworks on their Independence Night program at the Coliseum will treble anything in the 11-year history of the event.

The Fourth of July show also highlights a military pageant this year.

The Legion hasn't displayed any fireworks at the Coliseum since Pearl Harbor's sneak attack and they now have a three year supply to set off.

One of the top features of the Legion big show will be the exhibition of hand-to-hand fighting which 100 picked Marines from Camp Pendleton will stage.

In this demonstration the Marines will show bayonet and knife fighting methods as well as hand-to-hand tactics now being used on the Japs in the jungles.

Joe Bren is managing director of the Fourth of July program. He plans on opening the show with stunt acts and entertainment by clowns and tumblers on the greensward as the crowd files into their seats.

The gates of the Coliseum will open at 6:30 and community singing led by Hugo Kirkhofer will be held at 7 p.m.

The military pageant will start at 8 p.m. and the Army, Navy and Marines will participate.

Sunday afternoon in the Central Evangelical Community church. Dr. M. Owen Kellison, minister of the Wilshire Boulevard Christian church, was the speaker.

The class of 54 graduates marched in to the music of the "Coronation March" by Meyerbeer. Joe Derno of Torrance was the pianist. Rev. W. A. Penner, minister of the Church of the Nazarene, gave the invocation prayer. After a hymn and greetings brought in behalf of the Ministerial Union and by Principal Harold E. Perry in behalf of the school, Nadine Nickel, soprano, rendered the lovely composition, "Come Unto Me." Mrs. Kathryn Buffington accompanied the soloist.

Dr. Kellison spoke on the subject, "You Can Live Like That." He spoke of the various philosophies of life expressed in the parable of the Good Samaritan, the contrasting attitudes of selfishness, dishonesty, indifference and active goodwill. Each must choose how he will live his life and after what pattern, but only those who direct their lives in harmony with the kindest, most gentle and humble man who ever lived will come to know the true meaning and richness of life.

Prior to his recent coming to Southern California, Dr. Kellison was the executive secretary of the department of religious education for the United Missionary Society of the Disciples of Christ. He had also served prominent pastorates in Kansas, Missouri and Oklahoma. Lomita Woman Pleads Guilty to Child Beating

Mrs. Barbara Roberts, 27, of 615 Harbor Hills, Lomita, has pleaded guilty to violation of section 273A of the penal code in the alleged unjustifiable punishment of her daughter, Anna Louise Craven, age 8, and has asked for probation. Hearing on the probation will be held on July 3 in Justice court, Gardena, where the case was heard by Justice of the Peace Frank Carrell.

Thomas Roberts, step-father of the child, arrested on a similar charge, entered a plea of not guilty and will be tried in court on June 30 at 10 a.m.

Meanwhile, the child is in Juvenile hall.

The child, her body showing old and new welts and bruises, was examined before the hearing by a police matron, who reported her findings to the court. The mother admitted she had beaten the child with a bathing suit belt, following "nagging" by her husband, who said he considered the child disobedient.

The mother also told the court that on April 20, when she was not at home, the stepfather whipped the child, and when the mother returned home late in the afternoon, compelled her to whip the girl again.

This is the second time the attention of authorities has been called to the child's condition. Officials at the Orange Street school, where she is a pupil, reported the presence of welts and bruises on her body after hearing her story of beatings at home, but no action was taken then.

Action today grew out of a letter written by Andrew V. Bailey, an officer of the housing project in which the family lives, to Homer Daniels, investigator for the State Commission for the Protection of Children, telling of the beatings and stating that Roberts showed "sadistic tendencies."
