The affair is being sponsored by the retail merchants division of the Torrance Chamber of Commerce, of which Hillman R. Lee is president.

The big circus, destined to be the largest affair of its kind held in years in this county, will last from 9:30 a. m., with registration, to 10 p. m.

Curfew Relief For 16-Year-Olds And Up in View

Curfew will be lifted for juveniles over the age of 16 years if Councilman C. M. Gilbert has his way. Stating that boys and girls of 16 years and older are now holding responsible positions, he said that they should have their liberty to come and go as they pleased.

Chief of Police John Stroh, speaking on the subject at the City Council meeting Tuesday, declared that the curfew passes were taken away from all at the time of one high school student riots here, but that they were not effective with the older juveniles. He also urged that the curfew law be changed.

The matter was held over until the next meeting, to prepare for changing the curfew ordinance as requested.
