

Draft Age Men May Apply for Navy Radar Work

Men of draft age now may apply directly for service in the Navy for training in the field of Radar, the Navy Recruiting Station announced today.

All who have passed the Navy pre-induction physical examination and who qualify by written examination for Radar training will be given letters to their local Selective Service boards, who will earmark the man for this special naval service.

Successful candidates will be sworn in with the rating of seaman first class, and will be sent to a Radar training school in Chicago, Ill. A petty officer rating can be won when the ten months' course is completed.

The qualifying written examination is designed to disclose aptitude for training in the new and secret field of Radar. Questions on mathematics, physics, general science, electricity and radio are included. It is not a general I.Q. test.

Seventeen-year-old volunteers also are eligible to apply.

The Navy Recruiting Station, U. S. Postoffice and Custom House, San Pedro, will supply information and examine qualified men. Tests will be given between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. daily, Monday through Saturday.

TORRANCE WAR CHEST DRIVE NEARS GOAL AS CONTRIBUTIONS GAIN

Although not as yet ready to report "over the top" in its War Chest campaign, Torrance had considerably increased its contributions by Tuesday evening. At that time the Torrance campaign showed that contributions amounted to \$40,132, 80 per cent of the \$50,000 goal, according to report of Hillman Lee, chairman.

R. R. Smith, chairman of the "big money" campaign in the war industries, now has reported 4,247 contributions, amounting to \$33,948, 74 per cent of his \$45,615 quota, included in the Torrance total goal.

James Lynch, vice chairman in charge of the business division, reports additional contributions turned in for a total of 104 per cent of quota and \$2,517.

W. E. Bowen, colonel of residential divisions, reports the campaign is still slow there, with but one-quarter of the \$1,972 quota given.

"We particularly appeal to the homemakers here to get their contributions in for the War Chest, even though the man of the family may have made a donation at his place of work," Bowen said.

"This appeal affects every one of us, and a small amount laid away each week over a year's period will give needed help to the point of saving lives as used by War Chest agencies."

At the final report rally of leaders, P. G. Winnett, general chairman for the campaign, announced that due to the magnificent contribution of the motion picture industry the entire goal of \$7,613,579 had been over-subscribed with contributions as of Tuesday night totaling \$7,637,764. The rally took place in the Ambassador Hotel.

Charles W. Koerner, chairman of the motion picture division reported an all-time high of 23,853 donations to a total of \$1,170,349 from studios, artists, members of guilds, crafts and labor unions, for the use of "our boys, our homes and our suffering Allies."
