Clothing Drive For Russians Starts Dec. 11

Sponsored by leaders in local civic, religious and social affairs and conducted under the auspices of Russian War Relief Inc. of Southern California, a campaign for new clothing for children of Russia will be launched here for two weeks, beginning Dec. 11.

This campaign will be a part of a national drive to fill a ship with warm garments to be conducted simultaneously in every large city in the United States. Its beneficiaries will be the countless millions of orphaned and crippled children who are now returning to the cities in Russia which are again free from Nazi rule.
