

New Draft Rules Involving Men Under 30 Are Explained by WPB

Southland WPB officials today were operating under new draft rules providing for certification of requests for occupational deferment for what was termed "a vital hard core" of workers under 30 who are engaged in war production and supporting activities.

An endorsement by one of the 15 major war agencies will serve to back the employer's request when the application for deferment is presented to the local draft board.

Supplies of the form to be used by the employer—Form 42-A Special, Revised—have not yet reached this area, but will be available from Selective Service. WPB officials today had prepared an information sheet to guide employers. Each must submit to the procurement agency involved, a complete list of all employees between 18 and 30 who were classified as 2A or 2B on January 1, 1945. This list must be submitted in addition to the new draft deferment forms for the individuals whom the employer seeks to have deferred under the new rules as irreplaceable.

Louis M. Dreyfus, WPB chief, said the employer should:

1. Apply to the procurement agency from which he has obtained deferment certification, or from which he currently holds war contracts. Some 15 war agencies, including War Food Administration and the Petroleum Administration for War, are included in this list.

2. If he has no war contracts, or if he deals with more than one procurement agency, but not in sufficient volume to justify any one military agency to the jurisdiction, he may apply to WPB.

3. In no case may he file with more than one agency.

4. Submit in triplicate, a complete list of all men aged 18 to 30 who on January 1, 1945, were classified 2A or 2B. Don't include 2A(L), 2A(F), 2B(L), nor 2B(F).

5. List these employees in descending order of importance to production.

6. Indicate which of these men are both irreplaceable and so important that the firm cannot operate efficiently without them.

Dreyfus warned employers to begin to train replacements for

all possible men in the 18-30 group, since only a small percentage can be deferred. He also advised those who will look to WPB for aid, to get a copy of the instruction sheet and prepare the complete list of the 2A and 2B employees. No action will be taken on individual cases unless this list is submitted. The sheet is available from WPB offices at Room 1227, Western Pacific building, Los Angeles (15). If this step is omitted, the employer may find he has delayed too long and his key men may already be inducted before their deferment requests can be processed by the local draft board," Dreyfus explained.

Under the new plan, certification by State Selective Service Headquarters no longer is necessary.

Men engaged in technical work, planning, research, or development, for post-war purposes, do not need to be certified for deferment, Dreyfus commented.

Local governmental agencies will secure deferment directly from Selective Service and do not come under the certification procedure.
