New Plastics Factory to Open In Torrance

W. F. Wing and W. I. Barnard will operate a plastics manufacturing factory on 213th st., just east of the Construction Materials Co. plant, it was revealed at the City Council meeting Tuesday night.

The plant eventually will employ from 40 to 50 persons, and there will be no odors, nor dust, and the noise will be held to a minimum.

City Engineer G. M. Jain had referred the request for a permit to the City Council since the zoning classification of the new plant is for "light manufacturing."

Torrance Area Welfare Group Plans Dinner

The Torrance Area Welfare council held its regular meeting Monday night, May 21, in the Torrance Service Center. This meeting was highlighted by the presence of Miss Honora Costigan, director of the Inglewood District bureau of public assistance. Miss Costigan explained the services available to California residents who are eligible for relief under the old age security program, aid to needy children, aid to needy blind, and general relief, in addition to services for veterans. Mrs. Margaret McIntosh is the Torrance worker and may be consulted on Monday and Wednesday afternoons at the center, 1400 Cravens ave.

No Mass Layoff At Columbia DPC Pittsburg Unit

Cutbacks in the maritime industry due to the termination of the European war will soon affect operations of Columbia Steel Company's defense plant corporation foundry at Pittsburg, California, company officials revealed today. The extent of the discontinuance of this operation will be largely determined by orders on hand plus any future orders which may be made.

Should a complete shutdown of this operation occur, it will not affect Columbia Steel's nearby Pittsburg Works, a diversified steel mill sprawling over 400 acres. Nor will there be any wholesale layoffs of the some 500 employees of the DPC foundry, inasmuch as plans have already been formulated to absorb the excess personnel into Columbia's Pittsburg works. Notices to this effect have already been posted throughout the plant by the management.

The foundry was authorized as a war measure by the War Production Board and was built by the defense plant division of Columbia Steel Company, a U. S. Steel subsidiary, and has been operated under a lease arrangement with the United States government. The plant's facilities were designed expressly for the supplying of huge castings for the war maritime shipbuilding industry. With the slackening of shipbuilding activity, the need for the critical items produced by this foundry has shown a marked decrease.

Circus Will Show Here Next Week

Poodles is known as the greatest riding comedian of all time. Gracie Hanneford, a petite and charming brunette in her 20's is one of the most brilliant and daring riders of the sawdust ring.

Movie personalities are also featured with Tex Orton, famous for many thrilling moments in western films and the world's greatest knife throwing sensation, presents even greater thrills in the circus ring than on the screen. He throws knives from a distance of 30 feet completely encircling his pretty girl assistant.

Betty Miles is another personality familiar to western picture fans for her work in the Ken Maynard-Hoot Gibson series. Betty presents her famous educated horse, "Sonny." She is one of the most versatile riding performers in the circus being an accomplished bareback rider as well as a western trick riding champion.

Thrills of the New York World's Fair are introduced to the ring when Bassett and Bailey present their astounding equestrian feats. Jack Bassett stacks tables and chairs in a wobbly pile that reaches the peak of the big tent—then proceeds to climb this risky support to the top where he performs daring one-hand stands and other daring stunts.

Heading the high aerial thrillers is pretty Eleanore Velarde who defies death while performing her daring heel catch on the high swinging trapeze. One slip here would mean disaster as Eleanore never uses a net or other safety device. Benny Parker is another outstanding aerial star. Parker literally ties himself in knots while swinging on a trapeze in the very dome of the tent.

Performing elephants, dogs and ponies, tight wire artists, funny clown antics, supple acrobats and many other attractions are also including in the performances.

Lieut. Commander Drake, S.C., U.S.N.R., is the officer in charge of the new 91-are United States Navy Material Redistribution Center in Torrance.


FIREMEN HURT
