A veteran of the initial landings in the Solomon Islands and over two years in the Pacific,

Since coming to the Olathe station in March of last year, Lieutenant Watters served as the assembly and repair engine overhaul officer, progressing to the position of officer-in-charge of the assembly and repair department until it was disbanded last October. Then he was engineering officer for the utility aircraft unit, and officer-of-the-day immediately prior to his new assignment.

Lieutenant Watters was at Pearl Harbor on Dec. 7, 1941, as personnel officer of patrol squadron 23, and later was engineering assistant operations officer. During his one and one-half years in that squadron, he traveled greatly in the South Pacific and participated in the first air landings in the Solomon Islands.

Lieutenant Watters enlisted in the Naval Reserve in September 1940, as an apprentice seaman, after two years of study at the Long Beach Junior College. Soon afterwards, he went on a cruise to Cuba and proved his qualifications for admittance to the U. S. Naval Reserve Midshipman School, New York, N. Y. In June, 1941, he was commissioned ensign.
