

### Beach Bus Line Is Authorized By City Council

(Continued from Page 1-A) Torrance-Los Angeles buses operate up Vermont ave. through Gardena.

The two cities had a six months' agreement now expired, and Torrance had tentatively agreed to allow Gardena certain money to offset any loss of revenue to the Gardena bus lines caused by the operation of the Torrance buses through that city.

Cucci told the council Gardena had not suffered any loss. It is reported he had agreed to give Gardena \$25 a month, but that Gardena had requested \$1500 a year, according to a Gardena official.

The city hired John Brand as a bus operator at \$185 a month; hired Clayton R. Smith as a bus mechanic, class A at \$225 a month, and John G. Cox as bus attendant to keep the buses clean at \$190 a month. Ernie Treloar was changed from his previous classification of bus attendant to bus dispatcher, and Mrs. Edith Smith was changed from secretary to cashier-bookkeeper.

The council also voted to thank Deak Aircraft Co. for placing the benches at bus stops throughout the city.


### GAA Members Enjoy Banquet

### Proposal to Buy School Land Hit In TPA Letter

(Continued from Page 1-A) membership is restricted to City of Los Angeles residents.

"We are suffering with taxation without representation, and have no voice whatever about running our schools or spending the \$600,000 a year raised for Torrance schools," Mrs. Carr declared. "Los Angeles is spending half of our money in other parts of Los Angeles. We and our children are the victims of a vicious situation for which we are seeking a remedy. We will stay with it until we find it and bring about the control of our schools by our own board of education. Then our children will have the best, with less cost to the taxpayers."

The Los Angeles city school tax rate next year may be \$2.01, and the schools thereby will get about \$62,000 from Torrance in tax money and state average daily attendance support. Of this slightly more than \$300,000 will be spent on Torrance schools and most of this will go to teachers residing uptown in Los Angeles. The \$322,000 or so remaining will be spent on schools some of which may be 50 miles from Torrance.

Mrs. Carr, in her letter to the City Council, said:

"From a taxpayer's viewpoint, it is inconsistent for a community to be generous in support of a school system for more than 20 years, for that system to own property in the community, and then sell it back to the community which it is supposed to serve."

"It might be different if the land were to be used for commercial or adult benefit, but the whole transaction is in the interests of the children of Torrance. Under any other circumstances \$6000 might be a reasonable price for a block of land, but this block of land has already once been purchased in the interests of the education of Torrance children."

"The Torrance Parents' Association respectfully wishes to point out to the City Council that anything you agree to pay for this block of land will be a double payment, and not in the best interests of community economy."
