Farmers Get Break on No. 1 Grade Tires

Cars converted by farmers to serve as farm vehicles may be equipped with Grade 1 passenger tires if the vehicle cannot be operated with farm-impliment tires and if suitable used tires are not available in the community, the OPA announced today.

Applications for such tires should be made directly to the local ration board, since the county farm transportation committees of the War Food Administration which have handled such applications, will be discontinued on June 30.

Farm vehicles which the operator may wish to convert from steel-wheeled to rubber-tired are included in the new order's provisions.

Harnish Quits Post as WMC Director

After serving with the War Manpower Commission since its inception in the fall of 1942, H. R. Harnish, State Manpower Director for Southern California today announced his resignation as the Southland's manpower chieftain, to become effective about the middle of July. After a brief rest, Harnish revealed his intention to accept a position in private business.

"The War Manpower Commission has developed top-notch executives and a fine staff," Harnish said, "and I feel sure that future manpower problems in Southern California will be assured their faithful, willing and intelligent attention."

"May I take this opportunity," Harnish stated in announcing his resignation, "to express my sincere appreciation to my fellow employees of the War Manpower Commission, to management, labor, the press, radio, and the general public in Southern California for the splendid cooperation and support they have given me as State Manpower Director."

"Business, labor and the general public," the announcement continued, "have subjected themselves in good spirits to our necessary wartime manpower controls and I am sure that this cooperation will continue until victory over Japan is assured. I hope the day of complete victory will come very soon, so that we can all breathe freely again, and resume our normal way of life as Americans."
