Victory Gardens

Need More Gardens
A look around the county shows many of 1944 garden patches untilled in spite of high food costs and greater prospective food shortages than ever before. The political and economic ramifications of the world food supply make it imperative that home food production be pushed to the limit. It is not too late to start a summer garden now. Get in green beans, a late planting of sweet corn, as well as cucumbers, summer squash, leaf lettuce, and many other small vegetables.

Fall Garden Preparation
Many crops will grow to better quality during the winter months than in summer here in Southern California climate. This is hard for many people from the east to realize, but California is famed for its winter shipments of broccoli, cauliflower, celery, head lettuce, spinach, and many other crops. Make plans now for the early fertilization of an area for late August and September plantings. Organic composts or manures of various kinds should be applied two weeks to a month in advance of planting for best results. Wet the ground and spade the material under.

Fertilizing Summer Crops
Garden crops now half or two-thirds grown will benefit by the application of chemical fertilizers in shallow trenches at the side of the irrigation furrow. Supplies of nitrogen put into the ground in the spring, either as chemical fertilizers or manures, will be running low. Vigorous growth will frequently keep the vegetables ahead of pests and is, of course, desirable for many reasons—quantity, total yield, and rapid growth.

Chemical fertilizers must be used carefully during the summer when plants are growing or injury will result. Don't apply too much at one time. In general, application of sulphate of ammonia at the rate of nine ounces, or one measuring cup, for each one hundred square feet is ample. One and three-fourths pound, or four and one-half measuring cups, of Victory Garden Special fertilizer, containing 6 per cent nitrogen, 10 per cent phosphoric acid, and 5 per cent potash, will give the same amount of nitrogen.

When applied to garden crops in rows, the rate of distribution should be proportional to the distance between rows. For example, one cup of sulphate of ammonia, or four and one-half cups, of Victory Garden Special should be scattered down a shallow trench alongside of one hundred feet of rows spaced one foot apart. If the rows are two feet apart use twice as much for each 100 feet of row but divide it and put half on each side. If three feet apart, use three times as much, half on each side. This will result in the same rate of
