Replacement WACS Wanted By Army Corps



Veterans Warned to Investigate 'Deals' Carefully Before Signing

Torrance veterans service leaders have joined forces in calling attention of war veterans and their dependents to certain wartime rackets which have been designed to "get at" mustering-out-pay and savings of veterans, their dependents, and even the insurance money of stricken families of men who have given their lives to their country.

Four agencies in Torrance serve to guide veterans and their dependents, each is fully advised of their rights and privileges under the G.I. "Bill of Rights."

The agencies are: Veterans Service Council, Selective Service Board, James G. Caldwell, secretary; Veterans' Employment Council, U. S. Employment Service; Veterans of Foreign Wars, Postmaster C. Earl Conner, commander, and American Legion, James Brodie, commander-elect. Lester Fix retires as commander on Monday.

Government agencies and representatives of business, working largely through the National Association of Better Business Bureaus, are planning a drive to protect these unwary servicemen and their dependents. Following are some of the forms these rackets assume:

Selling purported partnerships in what seem to be prosperous businesses.

Advertising attractive jobs and requiring cash deposits to bind the deals.

Selling shares in inventions for postwar manufacture, worthless or overpriced farm lands, territorial rights for the sale of some articles or services.

Selling advice on loans, real estate and other projects and offering assistance to veterans in acquiring homes, farms and business.

Veterans are warned and advised to consult official advisory groups in their localities before becoming involved in any scheme or project which may be presented to them.

Obesity May Be Menace To Health

"Everybody loves a fat man" used to be a common saying, but obesity may be a menace to health or even to life itself.

Overweight of 20 pounds or more is frequently a sign of disease. In a number of instances in either sex, it is impaired action of the thyroid gland or the pituitary gland or both glands; or of the sex glands in women, that causes the deposit of fat in the tissues.

Obesity from overeating is not a sign of disease, but it does help to prepare the way for the onset of some very serious diseases, among them being diabetes, high blood pressure, some types of heart diseases, and apoplexy. These are much more common among overweight people than among those who are slender.

If a person is too stout, a physician should study the situation, to determine whether it is diseased or lazy glands that are at fault and if so prescribe suitable remedies. If obesity is due to overeating, a reducing diet is the answer.

It is safest for a person on a reducing diet to stay under a physician's supervision. However, there are a few fundamental principles that everybody ought to understand in undertaking such a diet. It should contain ample amounts of protein, vitamins, and minerals, with the reduction being chiefly in fats, oils, sweets, and starches. Sufficient bulk can be obtained by eating ample amounts of low-sweet and low-starch fruits and vegetables. Weight should not be reduced too rapidly.

Sage Being Prepared For Pacific Duty

Enroute to the United States from the European continent, Sgt. Lyle Sage of 2121 Gramercy ave., Torrance, is now being processed at Camp Atlanta in northeastern France, as a member of the first ETO armored division to be ordered to the Pacific.

Sgt. Sage is a member of Co. C 16th A.I.Bn. and served with the 13th Armored Division in the battle of the Ruhr Pocket and in the drive through Bavaria into Austria.

The 13th, popularly known as the Black Cat Division, captured more than 20,000 German prisoners in the fighting in the Ruhr and took an additional 19,000 in Bavaria. In the closing days of the war in Europe, it captured Hitler's birthplace city of Braunau, Austria, and liberated 14,000 Allied prisoners of war. He will be given a furlough before the division begins its training for action in the Pacific.
