The Banning Gophers, on the same date brought down the Torrance Eagles by a score of 7 to 4.


In Waleria, Torrance Stars fell victim to the Waleria Cats. Score, 16 to 1.

Lt. Daniel Assigned To Oran, Algeria

As a first pilot assigned to La Senia Air Base, Oran, Algeria, in the North African division of the Air Transport Command, Lieut. James A. Daniel, son of Mr. and Mrs. Arvil W. Daniel, of 1527 218th st., Torrance, is responsible for flying veterans of the European War to redeployment points for the United States and the Pacific.

La Senia Air Base, commanded by Lt. Col. Edgar B. Franklin, is the home of the North African division's vast fleet of C-47 transports that fly from the Atlantic to the Indian Ocean. Lieutenant Daniel is a first pilot, and is one of the thousands in the North African division, commanded by Brig. Gen. James S. Stowell, currently engaged in a two-fold program—rushing vitally needed war material to the China front and at the same time moving 40,000 veterans a month to the states. In this redeployment of troops, the greatest air movement in history, thousands of veterans from five theatres of war will shuttle through La Senia to the United States, where some will be discharged and other will move on to the Pacific.

After taking cadet training at Santa Ana, Calif., Lieutenant Daniel received advanced training at Marfa, Texas, before being assigned overseas, 10 months ago.

A graduate of Torrance High school, Torrance, Calif., Lieutenant Daniel attended the University of California at Los Angeles before entering the service in February, 1943.

Torrance Blood Donor Branch Quota Not Met

Torrance branch of the American Red Cross announced this week that 227 pints of blood were received from 264 donors admitted during the visit of the Red Cross Mobile unit in Torrance, Friday.

The total number of donors was reduced materially by persons who formerly had signed up to visit the Blood Bank cancelling out thinking that V-J Day's approach would eliminate the need for whole blood and blood plasma.

The quota for the mobile unit's visit was 400, Mrs. O. A. Kresse, Blood Bank chairman, said, and that quota probably would have been reached had not the Japanese capitulation become so apparent last week.

Members of the mobile unit declared Torrance's record was good compared to that of other cities. One instance was cited, that of Wilmington, where the quota was 600 pints and only 167 pints were received.

It was announced that the coming of V-J Day means that the visit last Friday probably will be the last of the mobile unit to Torrance.

PARACHUTE Infantry Sgt. Ray E. Eubanks, La Grange, N. C., awarded a Medal of Honor posthumously, died after clubbing to death 4 Japs with his rifle in a machine gun and mortar nest. Going to the relief of a platoon isolated by the enemy in Dutch New Guinea, he crawled to the Nips' position, was wounded and his rifle crippled, but charged in, swinging. After a shot dropped Eubanks, his squad killed 45 and effected the relief. War Bonds help equip such heroes.
