A Bible selection from Matthew reads: "In the end of the sabbath, as it began to dawn... came Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to see the sepulchre. And, behold... the angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat upon it... And the angel... said unto the women, Fear not ye; for I know that ye seek Jesus, which was crucified. He is not here; for he is risen, as he said." Mary Baker Eddy writes in "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures": "Jesus could give his temporal life into his enemies' hands; but when his earth-mission was accomplished, his spiritual life, indestructible and eternal, was found forever the same. He knew real life had no life and that real life is God; therefore he could no more be separated from his spiritual life than God could be extinguished."

Dr. Roy C. Crouch, industrial chaplain of the Church Federation of Los Angeles, will speak Sunday morning in Central Evangelical Community Church, Torrance.

Until recently the visiting minister served as pastor of the Union Church built at the government owned and operated basic magnesium plant between Las Vegas and Boulder Dam.
