Death Takes Mayor Murray, Santa Monica

Mayor Leonard J. Murray of Santa Monica died at 4:45 p.m. Friday in Santa Monica Hospital following an illness with which he was stricken Aug. 27, at his home, 703 11th St.

With him at the bedside at the time of his death were his wife, Mrs. Maurine Conway Murray; a sister, Mrs. Margaret Bruder; his niece, Betty Bruder, and Msgr. Nicholas Conneally, pastor of St. Monica's Parish.

Born Sept. 8, 1890, at Washburn, Wis., Mr. Murray came to Santa Monica in 1920 and established an automobile agency. Later he opened an agency in Torrance briefly and then returned to the beach city to conduct an automobile business. He was first elected Mayor in April, 1942, at a special election, and was re-elected for a four-year term on Dec. 7, 1943.

Charter Provisions Under provisions of the City Charter, D. C. Freeman, Commissioner of Finance, will become acting Mayor until the general election next Dec. 4, it was announced by Mrs. Irene Jones, Deputy Mayor.

Mr. Murray was a World War I veteran, a member of the Knights of Columbus, Rotary and the Elks and Eagles fraternal orders.

His widow expressed the hope that their son, Lt. William J. Murray, will be able to return from the Ryukyu Islands in time for the funeral. Mr. Murray also leaves two other sisters, Mrs. Arthur Roecker of Cleveland and Mrs. Paul Kierski of Minneapolis.

Solemn Requiem High Mass was celebrated for Mayor Murray at St. Monica's Church at 10 a. m. Tuesday. Interment was in Holy Cross Cemetery.
