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Torrance to Have Week-Day Release Time Religious Education Classes

In compliance with the recently enacted state law permitting religious instruction of public school children during school time, classes for the 4th, 5th and 6th grade pupils of Torrance Elementary and Carson st. schools will start Wednesday, September 26th, under the sponsorship of the cooperating churches in Torrance, of the Church Federation of Los Angeles. Children do not have to be attending Sunday school to participate. The classes are open for all protestant children. Subject matter is non-denominational, striving to present the great religious truths accepted by all protestants.

Torrance citizens serve on the local committee representing the cooperating churches. The four churches are financing the program as a part of their Christian education budget. The classes are free to all children.

Many Endorse Religious Education Week

Citing the importance of Christian principles in the establishing of permanent world peace and the need for teaching these principles, governmental, farm, business and political leaders are among those giving their endorsement to the 15th annual observance of Religious Education Week, Sept. 30 to October 7. The event is sponsored by 90 per cent of Protestant churches of the United States and Canada through the International Council of Religious Education. A. S. Goss, Washington, D. C., Master, The National Grange, in his statement declares that "from a very practical standpoint in meeting the problems of reconversion from a war status to a peace status, we may well turn to religion as the medium through which we will again establish the world on a peacetime basis where men can work together for the common good."

The principles of Christianity constitute a sound foundation on which to construct the necessary machinery to maintain amicable relations among nations is the belief expressed by Ernest J. King, Fleet Admiral, U. S. Navy, in endorsing the observance. Christian education teaching these fundamentals is needed, he believes.

"Much progress has been made toward the improvement and expansion of our entire educational system. However, with all our increased knowledge in world and national affairs, and technical skills, we were unable to prevent war. Contributing to this failure was the neglect of the fundamentals of all worthwhile education—religious teachings which should be given in the home and be supplemented in the churches," Admiral King declared.

The doom of a nation without religion is pointed out by Grace Noll Crowell, noted poet, when she stated in endorsing Religious Education Week:

"The cry of mankind today is 'Progress!' Plans for future are dazzling in their concept, but if the religion of Jesus Christ is left out of those plans, our nation will surely go the way of all godless lands."
